For the month of May 2026, the members of the Beaver Falls Fire Department received a total of three hundred ninety-three (**393**) hours of training (See attached). The highlights for the month are included below:

May 1-3: Fifteen (15) Firefighters attended the first annual Beaver County Fire Training Weekend. This training weekend was hosted by the county Firefighter's Association held at various locations throughout the region. These classes ranged from vehicle extrication, elevator rescue, hose line operations and Rapid Intervention to name a few.

Firefighter Curtis Pagley: FF Pagley attended a Water Rescue Emergency Response class held at the Oil City Fire Dept. This class is the second of a series of 4 water rescue programs to become a water rescue technician. This 16-hour class consisted of classroom, pool skills and moving water skills.

May 23: Six (6) firefighters attended Fire Operations in Multiple Dwellings class held at the Aliquippa Bureau of Fire. This class was instructed by a retired FDNY Squad 1 Lieutenant and covered buildings involving apartments, condos, and large multi-story residential buildings.

May 28: Eight (8) firefighters attended a Pet CPR & First Aid class held at our firehouse. This class was instructed by Howie and Melissa Parker from Liam Search and Rescue. This class will better prepare our members for resuscitation efforts in the event of a pet becoming a fire victim, or if one of the city's K-9 investments would ever need medical care.
