For the month of June 2026, the members of the Beaver Falls Fire Department received a total of five hundred thirty-eight (**538**) hours of training (See attached). The highlights for the month are included below:

Pump Operations I & II: Nineteen (19) firefighters attended both Pump Operations I and II classes held in the city. This class, instructed by Chief Stowe and Capt. Crawford, was to prepare our current and perspective drivers for a Driver/Operator Pumper certification exam at the end of June. These classes and study material were paid for with funds from a 2025 Assistance to Firefighters grant.

June 27: Ten (10) firefighters traveled to the Butler County Community College to take their Driver/Operator Pumper certification exam. This test consisted of both a written exam as well as a skills exam of random skills. These firefighters all passed their skills testing and are awaiting the results of their written exams.

Junior Firefighter Mark Laderer: Jr. Firefighter Laderer completed his Emergency Medical Technician course through the Community College of Beaver County. Jr. Firefighter Laderer, upon his 18th birthday this month, has already been accepted as a “regular” member and will immediately become an asset for our department.
