For the month of August 2026, the members of the Beaver Falls Fire Department received a total of two hundred ninety-seven (**297**) hours of training (See attached). The highlights for the month are included below:

August 14-16: Seven (7) firefighters attended the 2026 Jimmy Ellis Training Weekend. This training weekend consisted of a Friday lecture day at the Cranberry Marriott followed by hands-on training at various locations throughout the region. Our members attended classes ranging from firefighter survival techniques, forcible entry, rapid intervention as well as engine and truck company operations.

August 20: Five (5) firefighters attended our monthly training which consisted of ground ladders and hose line operations. Members covered multiple different ladder carries and throws, and reviewed/stretched the hose loads currently in place on our engine apparatus.
